1. All booster members introduced themselves.
2. This Friday, 09/16/16, is our first home football game against Bishop McDevitt
 - a. The band marches down to the stadium and plays at the opening of the game
 - b. The visiting team performs during ½ time
 - c. The students are allowed to purchase food during the 3rd quarter; however, they are not allowed to have the food and drink in the stands with them
 - d. The chaperones will stay in the stands and watch the students' instruments, bags, etc...
